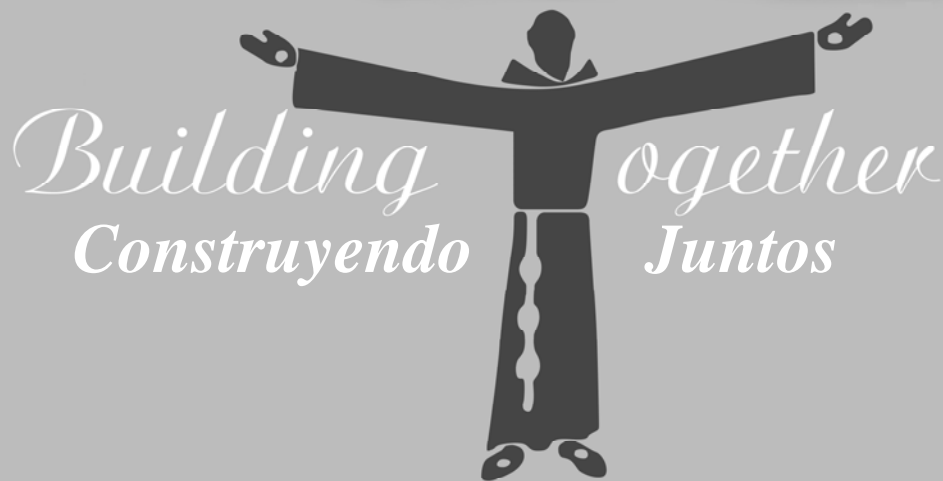
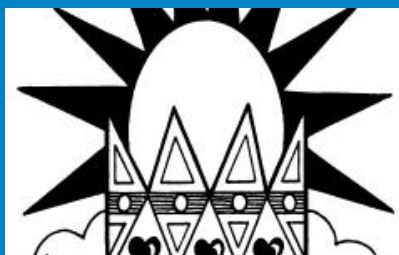

**Stewards of God's Grace Capital Campaign** - Our all-parish, diocesan-wide capital campaign to help strengthen our parishes and our diocese begins soon. The Stewards of God's Grace Capital Campaign will achieve several objectives for our parishes and our diocesan ministries: work towards a fully funded pension plan for retired priests, fund continuing education for priests, provide support for a priest sabbatical fund, provide seed monies for a priest aid fund; bolster tuition assistance for Catholic schools, provide for training and certification of teachers of religious education; enrich programming for youth and young adults; generate new work space and enhanced services for Catholic Charities clients; sustain the current and future needs of our parishes, and improve the energy efficiency of the diocese with the installation of new windows. Our parish will actively take part in the all-parish, diocesan-wide capital campaign beginning in March.

Here are some of the *frequently asked questions* that have surfaced regarding our campaign effort. Keep in mind, our diocese serves the young and young at heart with Sacramental preparation, Eucharistic celebrations, faith formation and outreach to those in need. As good stewards, we are asked to be men and women with and for others, to serve the greater good.

### **How will the progress of this campaign be communicated to me?**

### **My singular gift doesn't matter to a project of this size, does it?**

Yes, your gift matters – each and every gift matters. The campaign goals of this effort are far reaching across our diocese and as close as our local parish. With every parish family coming together on behalf of the greater good, we can accomplish all that we set out to do. Everyone's gift matters!

### **Why are parishioners being asked to consider a specific dollar amount? How was that amount determined?**

All parishioners are being challenged to consider a sacrificial stretch gift for this important campaign. Your specific request amount was determined by a number of factors, including:

- Your past support of the parish and diocese;
- Feedback received during the Feasibility Study;
- A general perception of what level of donation you may be able to give to the campaign; and
- The need to challenge parishioners to sacrifice so that our important goals can be met. Remember, the amount that you are asked to consider will be spread out over three years.

The specific request amounts you are asked to prayerfully consider are not intended to embarrass or offend anyone. If the request amount is too much, please consider an amount that would be meaningful to you and more appropriate for your household. If you can afford to give more than what is asked, we humbly and graciously welcome such generosity. Your sacrifice, in any amount, will help make the difference in this campaign and be a blessing to your parish and the Diocese.

### **How do I know an investment in this campaign will be used specifically for these goals?**

All gifts to the campaign will be used solely for the restricted purposes of the campaign and for no other purposes. The restricted purposes have been detailed in this case statement. The majority of the funds will be used for endowments. These endowments are maintained by The Catholic Foundation of Southwestern Indiana, an independent corporation with a separate Board of Directors, comprised of lay persons and clergy.

### **Is my pledge legally binding? Will it be confidential?**

A pledge is not legally binding; it is simply your best-faith intention. A pledge is a gift, one you consider to be meaningful to you. All we ask is that you do your best and advise the Diocese of Evansville of any financial changes that will impact your pledge. All pledges will be kept as confidential as possible. Only the people responsible for maintaining the records will have access to your pledge amount.

### **How much will my parish get back of the pledges and gifts that we give?**

Of the funds that a parish raises there will be a 50/50 split. The parish will receive 50% to address immediate local parish needs as outlined in this case statement. The other 50% will be allocated to the additional outlined areas of need listed in this case statement.

### **How is this capital campaign different from the annual CPC?**

While some of the areas of support are similar, the CPC is the annual fund or operational budget of the diocese and its many ministries serving the parishes and people. These annual core funds keep the programs running within their annual budget. This capital campaign is to address ministry needs of the diocese over and above annual funding. Almost 60% of the funds raised in this capital effort will be committed as endowed funds on behalf of the many diocesan ministry areas (seminarian education, continuing education and certification for faculty, staff and volunteers).

## Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Imagine waking up one day to find a sore or scab and knowing that your life could be forever changed! From the time of Moses, those who were found with persistent skin diseases (known at the time as leprosy) were separated from the community, isolated from family and friends, judged by others and kept apart. What faith the man in today's Gospel must have had to approach Jesus! He not only put his physical life in Jesus' hands, he trusted that the Lord would look at him with mercy rather than judgment, that Jesus would see him rather than his disease. Jesus looks on us with mercy as well, and waits for us to cry out, "If you wish, you can make me clean." The man is a model of faith, and of the witness of one who cannot help but declare the power of God. He acted as Saint Paul urged the community in Corinth to do, giving glory to God through his actions.

### OUT AND IN

The leper who had been cast out was healed. He was suddenly free to interact with others, to dwell with family, to rejoice in the company of friends. He encountered the healing, merciful love of Christ and found new life. The one who healed him, Jesus, was made to stay outside of the towns and villages to which he went, surrounded by people who needed his healing touch. Jesus' love is greater than whatever might trouble us. He looks with compassion on those who are broken, breaking himself open for the sake of others. Jesus puts himself in the place of those who are in need. Those who are on the margins of life or of the faith community are held closely in the loving gaze of the Lord. Those who are ill are assured of God's care and compassion. Those who are weak find strength in Christ, who is ever ready to attend to the needs of the hurting, lost, and broken.

### ACT IN FAITH, ACT ON FAITH

In what ways are you isolated, hurting, or broken? Does someone else judge you unfairly? Are there circumstances that are beyond your control that overwhelm you or dictate the way you live your life? The Lord waits for your call, your cry in faith. Do you know the healing, compassionate, caring love of God for you, in prayer, sacraments, or the attention of others? Witness to the powerful love of God through your attitudes and words, your actions and interactions with others. Imitate Christ. Show mercy to others. Be a healing presence when relationships are torn apart. Have you encountered the love of God in your life? Give witness to this love at home, work, parish, and the world. Give glory to God as you act on faith.
